## When Someone Dies

## Procedure To Be Followed After A Death

The Procedure to follow after a death will depend on the circumstances surrounding the death. A Medical Certificate of the Cause of Death (MCCD/Form 11) will be issued by a doctor who will forward the certificate electronically to the registrar.

## When The Death Occurs At Home

Inform the on-call doctor as soon as possible that death has occurred. During the day this will be your local GP surgery. Outwith normal working hours you should call NHS24 on 111.

## When The Death Occurs In A Hospice or Nursing Home

Staff will inform you of the death of your loved one and arrange for a doctor to call to confirm the death. They will help you with advice until you contact your chosen funeral director to make the funeral arrangements.

## When The Death Occurs In Hospital

The hospital staff will inform the next of kin or named person of the death. The deceased will be transferred to the hospital mortuary until a funeral director is appointed. The general office will arrange for the MCCD to be sent to the registrar.

#### **Medical Review Process**

Following changes to the process of death certification and registration in Scotland in 2015 the deceased person may be selected at random for a medical review. These reviews are designed to check the quality and accuracy of MCCDs and improve how information about the cause of death is recorded.

About 10% of all MCCDs issued in Scotland are randomly selected for review by the Death Certification Review Service.

There are two types of review:

- Level 1 the DCRS will aim to complete a Level 1 review within 24 hours
- Level 2 the DCRS will aim to complete a Level 2 review within 72 hours

Being selected for medical review is no reflection on the person who has died, or their family, although it does mean you may not be able to register the death right away. The registrar will tell you about the review and how long this may take.

You can start making funeral arrangements while the review is happening however, the funeral cannot take place until the review is complete and a Certificate of Registration of Death (Form 14) has been issued to the funeral director.

## When The Death Is Referred To The Procurator Fiscal

If death occurs due to an accident, sudden death or unexplained circumstance the procurator fiscal will be informed and a post-mortem may be required. The doctor will be unable to issue a MCCD on this occasion.

In these circumstances the hospital pathology department will produce a certificate once the post-mortem has taken place to confirm the cause of death. The MCCD will be collected by your funeral director from the mortuary after the post-mortem is complete and forwarded on to the Registrar.

## Registering A Death - Who May Register?

In Scotland, you are required to register a death within 8 days. The death may be registered with any registrar in Scotland.

The death may be registered by:

- Any relative (this includes the spouse or civil partner of the person who died or a relative by marriage or civil partnership)
- · Any person present at the death
- The executor or other legal representative
- The occupier of the premises where the death took place
- Or if there is no such person, any other person possessing the information needed for registration

Your funeral director will provide you with forms to be completed and returned to them. They will forward this information on to the registrar, on your behalf.



The registrar will liaise with you by telephone and email to confirm all the details taken are correct before registration of the death is finalised.

## **Arranging A Funeral**

## Information you will need to provide includes:

- The deceased person's full name at time of death
- · Any names previously used, including maiden surnames
- Their date and place of birth (town and county if born in the UK and country if born abroad)
- Their last known address
- Their occupation
- The full name, date of birth and occupation of a surviving spouse or civil partner
- Whether the deceased was in receipt of a state pension or any other state benefit
- The full name and occupation of the deceased's parents, including the maiden name of the deceased's mother

## Additional documents required if available:

- Birth Certificate
- NHS Medical Card
- Marriage / Civil Partnership Certificates

The registrar will email a copy of the Certificate of Registration of Death (Form 14) to your chosen funeral director. This will allow a burial or cremation to take place.

## **Documents You Will Receive**

The registrar will provide you with an abbreviated Extract of Death certificate free of charge.

You will be able to purchase a full Extract of Death certificate, which includes details of the cause of death, at a cost of £10.00 per copy if purchased within 30 days of registration (£15.00 thereafter). This document may be required by the executor and other legal or financial services involved in managing the personal affairs of the deceased.

#### **Tell Us Once**

*Tell Us Once* is a service, managed by the registrar, that lets you report a death to most government organisations in one go saving you time and unnecessary distress.

Tell Us Once will notify HM Revenue and Customs (HMRC), Department for Work and Pensions (DWP), Passport Office, Driver and Vehicle Licensing Agency (DVLA), The Local Council - to stop pension payments, council tax, electoral services, blue badge, library cards, bus pass and other social services.

## **Legal Advice & Support**

When death occurs, it is very important to ascertain whether or not the deceased has left a Will. This is a legal document

which may contain instructions regarding details of the funeral arrangements.

A Will may be with a solicitor or bank for safe keeping or amongst personal papers in the deceased's home.

It is advisable to consult a solicitor at this time. The solicitor will be able to help with probate, proving the Will is valid. They will support you to finalise the details of the deceased's estate, if required.



## **Help With Funeral Costs**

The Funeral Support Payment is a new payment available to people in Scotland, who receive certain benefits or tax credits, to help meet the cost of the funeral. This payment replaces the Funeral Expense Payment from DWP.

## Arranging The Funeral With D&A Munn Ltd

#### **Professional Fees & Disbursements**

Professional Fees: These charges are for the professional services of the funeral director and supporting staff. They include conveyance of the deceased to our premises, care of the deceased before the funeral, the funeral director's attendance to all arrangements, completion of necessary documentation, communication with third parties by email and telephone calls, home visits, a coffin suitable for either burial or cremation, personal supervision of the funeral on the day of the funeral service and the provision of a hearse.

**Disbursements:** These are third party fees paid out by the funeral director on behalf of the family while arranging the funeral.

Examples of these are cremation fees, church fees, organist's fees, intimations and family acknowledgements in newspapers, floral tributes, catering, musicians, digital support and any additional services you may require.

#### **Coffins & Caskets**

We supply our bespoke 'Cruachan' coffin as standard in a choice of light or golden oak finish, suitably furnished for burial or cremation. Our high-quality coffin features pressed panels with a raised lid and is offered with a choice of cord colour for burial services.

You have the option to choose any style or colour of coffin you wish. We will help you to choose your preferred style and order the coffin from the appropriate supplier for you.

We can supply environmentally friendly coffins, to order, made from alternative material to wood which can include wicker, bamboo and cardboard in a wide range of colours. Please feel free to discuss your requirements with us.

We have an in-house engraving suite and engrave all our coffin and ashes casket nameplates. We also engrave personalised lair markers to place at a grave until a memorial headstone can be inscribed or erected.



## **Viewing The Deceased**

Grieving is a natural process that can take place after any kind of loss. When a loved one passes away grief can be a very over-powering emotion. To help overcome this, you are invited to sit alone or with family members, to share your final moments and thoughts with your loved one, in the privacy of our family viewing room.

## Venues For The Funeral Service and Reception

A funeral service can take place in a church or crematorium, in most cases, close to where the deceased has lived. However, there are no rules against holding a funeral service in a less traditional venue such as a community hall, at home, at a sports facility or indeed, outdoors.

The funeral reception is a social gathering held after the funeral service and this is an opportunity for family and friends to offer support to each other, share memories and stories of their loved one and enjoy some light refreshment.

We can arrange catering at various venues. Most venues will offer to handle the catering with a range of options, to suit dietary requirements, based on a per-person charge.

## **Bereavement Support**

Grief can be triggered many months after a death. ## **Quality Assurance**

#### **Funeral Director Code of Practice**

The Funeral Director Code of Practice was introduced by the Scottish Government on 1st March 2025 to ensure that every person in Scotland will have a dignified and respectful funeral and bereaved families can be reassured that good standards of care will be provided.

This Code of Practice is part of the Burial and Cremation (Scotland) Act 2016 and applies to all Funeral Directors in Scotland who must adhere to minimum standards in their care of the deceased which will assist in providing transparency in the goods and services offered to the bereaved.

The Code will provide reassurance to grieving families about the dignified and professional care of their loved one in relation to transport and care of the deceased, care of the deceased at our premises, viewing the deceased, arranging a funeral service, management of retiral collections, ashes management, business continuity and managing risk.

We welcome the introduction of the Code which strengthens the gold-standard level of care we extend to you, our client and to your loved one.

## Important Information To Consider

## **Jewellery & Personal Effects**

Jewellery may be left with your loved one or returned to the applicant according to the wishes of the relatives. When we remove jewellery from the deceased, we take a photograph of the items and this forms part of the jewellery receipt, signed by the applicant when the jewellery is returned to them. For peace of mind we ask that all jewellery and personal effects required are collected and signed for prior to the day of the funeral.

## **Motor Insurance**

Insurance cover on a vehicle owned by the deceased ceases immediately at the time of death. The next of kin or appointed executor should inform the insurance company concerned who will offer immediate transfer of cover as appropriate.

The vehicle registration documents should be returned in due course to the licensing authority for transfer of ownership to the beneficiary. The driving licence of the deceased should be returned to the licensing authority for cancelling.

#### House Insurance

Contact the property's existing home insurance company as soon as you can to advise them of the owner's death. If a home is left unoccupied for more than 30 days most standard home insurance policies become void or cover is significantly reduced.



## A Digital Life

## What Happens To Your Digital Life When You Die?

People of all ages have embraced the internet and the many new ways it allows us to communicate and share experiences with one another. But what happens to all this activity when someone dies?

Our helpful information will outline what you can do in advance to make sure your digital legacy is managed in a way you'd like. Whether that's making sure precious photos aren't lost or letting your Facebook friends remember you via a memorial page.

## What Is A Digital Legacy?

Most adults have a mobile phone, tablet or computer, sometimes all three. A person's digital legacy includes all the digital information they leave behind following their death.

Here are some examples:

Email accounts / Online bank accounts / Social media accounts / Subscription accounts e.g. Spotify and Netflix / Trading accounts e.g. Amazon and eBay / Intellectual property such as domain names, blog content, logos or ebooks.

## What To Do When Someone Dies: Social Media Platforms

#### Facebook

When someone dies you can have their Facebook account deleted or memorialised which allows family and friends to continue sharing memories on that person's timeline.

When a profile is memorialised the words 'Remembering' appear next to their name. Facebook also allows users to choose a legacy contact.

This person can announce a death, post details of a funeral service and change the profile picture. Visit the Facebook Help Centre for all the information you need.

## Instagram

Like Facebook, Instagram allows loved ones to remove an account or memorialise an account where posts shared are still visible, but do not appear in public search listings. Visit the Instagram Help Centre for all the information you need.



## Managing Your Digital Afterlife

It's thought we each have around 27 different passwords.

This might explain why 37% of us forget a password at least once a week, and they're our accounts! No wonder friends and family can find it a struggle to track down all a deceased person's online accounts.

- 1. List all your digital accounts Use something like a Social Media Will Template or a Digital Assets Log to make a list of all the accounts and digital assets you have online.
- 2. Don't forget passwords to the hardware Be sure to leave a record of PIN numbers and passwords for your mobile phone, external hard drive or computer.
- 3. Decide what you'd like to happen How would you like information in these accounts to be handled in the event of your death? It's worth noting down what your wishes are.
- 4. Decide who should do this Perhaps someone is better suited to memorialising your Facebook Account and another to sorting and sharing your precious family photo collection?
- 5. Store in a safe place Make sure a trusted friend or family member is aware of where this information will be kept. It's not a good idea to store passwords on your Mac or PC in case your machine is hacked.

## **Funeral Options**

Not too long ago, there was really only one type of funeral service. With Britain being more diverse than ever, funeral formats are far less rigid than previously.

From dress code to music, flowers to vehicles, the type of funeral you have has become much more a reflection of the individual rather than dictated by tradition. There's a much wider variety of funeral options today, giving you an opportunity to have a more bespoke send off.

#### **Traditional Funerals**

Most funerals taking place in the UK would be considered as traditional. A traditional funeral service can either be held in a local church or a crematorium and then either followed by a burial or cremation.

Broadly speaking, a traditional funeral service will be a religious service taken by either a Church of Scotland minister, a Catholic father or any other religious denomination.

#### **Celebrant or Humanist Funerals**

A celebrant or humanist funeral is a non-religious ceremony for either a burial or cremation service which is becoming increasingly common.

This can be more appropriate for those who neither believed or lived according to religious principles, nor accepted religious views of life or death.

#### **Direct Cremations**

Direct cremation funerals are for families or individuals who want a very simple, straightforward funeral that requires minimal organisation and is less expensive than other types of funerals. Following initial contact with your funeral director, the coffin will be transported to a crematorium, in a suitable vehicle, on a date and time arranged on your behalf. No family members or friends will be present at the cremation due to no service being held.

## **Green Funerals**

Green funerals are becoming increasingly popular, as families or individuals consider a more environmentally friendly way of arranging a funeral.

This can range from planning a whole green funeral or considering certain aspects of a green funeral to incorporate into a traditional funeral, such as the choice of coffin or having a green burial.

The goal of a natural burial is to return the body to the earth in the most efficient natural process. Green burials are intended as an environmentally sustainable alternative to existing funeral practices such as cremation which is very carbon intensive.


